WELCOME TO FJÄLLBACKA!

The town of Fjällbacka is named after Fjället, the large rocky hill that dominates the local skyline. The older section of the town lies at the foot of Fjället and faces the sea, whereas more recent developments have been built on the fields that lie inland from the coast and up on the surrounding hills. In the waters beyond the coastline the Fjällbacka archipelago stretches across the horizon, with the Väderöarna islets at its westernmost tip. Fishing, shipping and trade were once important local industries, but have now been replaced by manufacturing and tourism. The Fjällbacka area also offers a number of nature reserves worth visiting.

Swedish actress Ingrid Bergman loved to stay in Fjällbacka when she visited from abroad. A number of home-grown author Camilla Läckberg's popular detective novels are also set right here in her home town.

What's more, the impressive Kungsklyftan gorge that runs through Vetteberget hill was one of the locations used to film the now-classic Swedish children's film "Ronia, the Robber's Daughter", based on the book by Astrid Lindgren.

1. Galärbacken

Galärbacken, which leads down to the guest marina and Ingrid Bergmans Torg, is dotted with a number of cosy shops, cafés and restaurants.



2. Ingrid Bergmans Torg

Swedish actress Ingrid Bergman often visited Fjällbacka during her stays in Sweden. From 1958 onward, Bergman spent many summers on Dannholmen islet in the outermost archipelago, just west of Fjällbacka. After her death in 1982, her ashes were scattered in the waters around the island. A statue was also erected in her memory in Fjällbacka's public square, which was renamed Ingrid Bergmans Torg.

3. Kungsklyftan

Hiking up the steep stone trail and stairways through the unusual Kungsklyftan gorge that divides Vetteberget hill is a great experience. Scenes from the beloved Swedish children's film "Ronia, the Robber's Daughter", based on the Astrid Lindgren book, were once filmed here. While you should be prepared for a challenging walk to get there, once you arrive at Vetteberget's summit, you will be rewarded with an enchanting view of the Fjällbacka archipelago.
